# Group B (In-person Session): Parliamentary Inclusion

- Access to parliamentary venues for disabled persons: the parliamentary building is an important symbol as being the house where elected representatives work. Both MPs, staff and visitors, no matter if they have disabilities, should be able to enter that building physically.
- People with hearing or visual impairment should also have access to legislative documents and be able to follow political debates in the chamber. Discussion on possible technical and physical ways to handle this.
- Representation of women and minorities in the parliament: What actions can be taken to enable women and minorities to work as MPs on the same conditions as male MPs?
